Established in 2004, the UWA Fogarty Scholarship Program is one of Australia's premier scholarship programs. It awards WA's brightest and most committed students, scholarships for the entirety of their university degree.

The Program aims to strengthen our society by investing in exceptional young people who can use their skills and commitment to lead significant positive change in our community, state and nation. The Scholarship is a joint initiative between the Fogarty Foundation and the University of Western Australia and 2023 marks the 20th anniversary of the establishment of this special partnership.

Ten new scholarships are awarded each year to our State's highest achieving students. Scholars are selected based on academic excellence and outstanding achievements in at least two areas of either: leadership, community involvement, sports, the arts and enterprising initiatives.

UWA Fogarty Scholars are awarded scholarships for their undergraduate degree and to continue their postgraduate study at UWA. From 2022, Scholars wishing to pursue postgraduate studies in specialist areas are also able to be supported, in partnership with Australian National University (ANU), to undertake their studies at ANU in Canberra.

A key element of the Scholarship is a tailored approach to leadership building that spans the Scholars' entire university degree. The Program connects Scholars with local and international leaders and provides Scholars and Alumni with a range of leadership opportunities. Scholars are also supported through academic mentoring, career and personal enrichment engagements and, paramount to the program, a strong network of likeminded young leaders.

Scholars also receive support for their own initiatives, and, where these grow to a substantive size, can access the Scholars Enterprise Investment Program (SEIP).

Many also achieve other prestigious academic scholarships during or after their time as a UWA Fogarty Scholar.

In 2023, we have 49 Scholars and 138 Alumni who are studying, working and making a contribution in WA and around the world.

The Fogarty Foundation and the University of Western Australia view leadership and enterprise as crucial to the development of strong and prosperous communities.

The UWA Fogarty Foundation Leadership and Enterprise program is designed to expand Scholars' horizons by initiating opportunities for the Scholars to learn from, and have access to, a network of leaders; gaining insight into how our community works and how they can make a positive contribution now and in the future.

Since the scholarships were established 20 years ago, the Scholars have instigated several initiatives which have been successful across a broad range of sectors. In our 20th year we are proud to celebrate and support the Scholars and their initiatives as they go from strength to strength.

Fogarty Futures Leadership Conference

This initiative was started by the Fogarty Scholars Association in 2013 and has been convened by first year Fogarty Scholars every year since.

The Fogarty Futures Leadership Conference empowers Year 10 and 11 students with leadership skills for the future. Held over a long weekend in, or near, Perth; the aim of the Conference is to encourage students to develop a passion for social justice and benefit their local communities.

Teach Learn Grow

Teach Learn Grow (TLG) was co-founded in 2011 by UWA Fogarty Scholar Dave Sherwood and teacher, Travis Elliot. TLG's vision is for every child in Australia to have equal opportunities in education regardless of location, background or circumstance.

TLG's Rural Program provides free one-on-one tutoring and mentorship to primary students experiencing educational disadvantage in rural and remote Australian communities. During a one-week intensive, students participate in individually tailored tutoring while passionate and high-achieving volunteers from metro areas encourage and promote enthusiasm about learning.

The eMentor Program provides free one-on-one mentoring to upper-primary school students experiencing disadvantage in rural and remote communities. Over eight weeks, students connect with passionate Perth-based volunteers using an online platform to explore Australian Curriculum mentoring topics selected by their school teacher. Many Fogarty Scholars volunteer to be part of this intensive, which they find invaluable and enlightening.

Bloom

Bloom is a youth-led non-profit that has created a community of changemakers, challenging the problems of the world. Bloom aims to create an environment where entrepreneurs and innovators can thrive, innovate and acquire the tools for success.

UWA Fogarty Scholar Mark Shelton was the co-founder and inaugural CEO of Bloom. His vision was to bring together a community of young people creating amazing things.

Bloom provides a wide range of programs, catering from school-aged students to the young leaders of the future. The Schools Program brings entrepreneurship and innovation into schools while catering for the curriculum. The flagship Launchpad Program gives university students the opportunity to create a business through a 12-week accredited unit for UWA and Curtin University.

Shine is Bloom's leadership course, providing young adults with a leadership toolkit for the future.

Bloom is currently home to 50 start-ups and an online community of over 4,000.

ASEAN – Australia Strategic Youth Partnership

The ASEAN-Australia Strategic Youth Partnership (AASYP) empowers young people aged 18-29 years old from across Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and Australia to engage with each other and the most pressing issues of today.

The partnership helps to build young people's expertise and engagement with ASEAN-Australia affairs, and provide tangible opportunities for young people to engage in promoting peace and prosperity across the relationship.

They use the platform to build knowledge, inspire engagement and create connections to give young people a voice on the complex regional issues that need to be solved together.

Purposeful

Purposeful was founded in 2018 by UWA Fogarty Scholar Elizabeth Knight. Since its inception, Purposeful has been working to help young people find their place in the world, with careers they are passionate about.

Purposeful has delivered its purpose and career discovery programs with 10,000+ students and 35 schools since 2019. It has delivered its Exploration Expo for 650 students to date, with 10 Exploration Expo's booked already for 2023. Since its launch, Purposeful has become an integral part of WA's innovation ecosystem, empowering young people to become curators of their own career path and finding problems they are passionate about solving.

A number of Fogarty Scholars are the recipients of additional prestigious awards and scholarships before, during and after their time as a UWA Fogarty Scholar.

This section presents a summary of some of the prestigious Awards and the Fogarty Scholars who have been recipients.

Beazley Medallist (WA)

The Beazley Medal is Western Australia's top academic award. It was introduced in 1984 in honour of the Hon Kim Beazley AC, the former Federal Minister of Education and former Governor of Western Australia (2018 to 2022) (amongst other portfolios held); who was also a Rhodes Scholar from WA.

The Medal is presented by the Western Australian School Curriculum and Standards Authority and is awarded to the West Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) student with the highest examination marks across five Year 12 Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) courses. Students who receive the Beazley Medal rank the highest amongst all WACE students in Western Australia and become Fogarty Scholars.

The General Sir John Monash Scholarship (Australia)

The General Sir John Monash Scholarship is regarded as Australia's most prestigious postgraduate Scholarship award. This Scholarship is granted in honour of General Sir John Monash, a notable leader due to his engineering and defence contributions to Australia. Unlike other scholarship awards, applications are not limited by age, field of study or choice of overseas university. Scholars are provided with a generous financial contribution towards their studies and gain the opportunity to join a collaborative international network of 233 John Monash Scholars.

The Rhodes Scholarship (UK)

As one of the most prestigious post-graduate scholarships in the world, The Rhodes Scholarship provides students with the opportunity to study at the University of Oxford.

The postgraduate full-time program is fully funded and allows Scholars to live in the UK for two or more years. The program was established in 1902 and is regarded as the oldest graduate scholarship in the world.

Fulbright Scholarship (USA)

The Fulbright Program in Australia, and around the world, has a rich history and proud legacy supporting educational excellence and cultural exchange. The program aims to increase binational research collaboration, cultural understanding, and the exchange of ideas.

Fulbright Postgraduate Scholarships allow postgraduate students to conduct research in the U.S. OR supports postgraduate students not currently enrolled in a degree program to undertake a U.S. postgraduate program such as a Master’s.

Since its establishment in 1946, the Fulbright program has grown to become the largest educational exchange scholarship program in the world.

UWA Fogarty Scholars who later became Fulbright Scholars are:

Robert Marshall (UWA Fogarty Scholar 2012 - 2014) was awarded a Fulbright in 2015 to study a Master of Public Administration at Columbia University.

Joshua Dunne (UWA Fogarty Scholar 2015 - 2018) was awarded a Fulbright in 2019 to study a Master of Security Studies at Georgetown University in Washington DC.

James Dingley (UWA Fogarty Scholar 2017 - 2020) was awarded a Fulbright in 2021 to study a Masters of Space Systems Engineering in Aeronautics and Astronautics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

New Colombo Plan Scholarship (Indo-Pacific)

The New Colombo Plan Scholarship is a prestigious program that grants undergraduate students the opportunity to undertake up to one year of academic exchange across 40 locations in the Indo-Pacific region. The goal of the program is to provide students with a transformational educational experience, while deepening Australia’s relationship with countries in the Indo-Pacific region.

Westpac Future Leaders Scholarship (Australia)

The Westpac Future Leaders Scholarship is a post-graduate program aimed at supporting gifted students in developing the nation’s technological innovations, fostering Australian-Asian ties, reducing Australia’s environmental impact, and creating a more inclusive country.

Westpac Future Leaders Scholars

Leela Dilkes-Hoffman (UWA Fogarty Scholar 2011 - 2013) was awarded a Westpac Future Leaders Scholarship in 2016 and completed her PhD in chemical engineering at the University of Queensland. Her research focused on the material development and sustainability analysis of biodegradable food packaging.

The Jeremy Cheang Award is a special annual prize, presented in memory of the late Jeremy Cheang, a former UWA Fogarty Scholar.

The Jeremy Cheang Award recognises a Scholar for their contribution to their area of study, to UWA and/or the wider community. The Award also acts as a way of supporting the recipient in an initiative or activity that links to their area of study, and/or benefits UWA or the wider community.
